

TITLE: INFANT TECHNICIAN

QUALIFICATIONS:

1. Sixty units of college course work including courses in child development, special education, nursing, physical or occupational therapy or other related field; or, 48 units including course work as per above and work experience in special education or early childhood education
2. Experience in infant/preschool development program, special education program for severely handicapped or physically handicapped, or program serving children birth to preschool (infant care, etc.) desirable
3. Bilingual ability may be required, depending on assignment

REPORTS TO: Administrator as assigned

JOB GOAL: Serves as paraprofessional liaison between professional staff and parents; trains parents in development intervention activities and works with children, parents and staff in group settings

PERFORMANCE RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Makes home visits on regular basis to train parents in individually prescribed developmental intervention activities with their own child and acts as role model for parents in home setting
2. Collects data for use by professional staff
3. Confers with staff members and parents regarding needs of children
4. Assists in toddler and/or preschool groups and parent/child teaching groups
5. Transports children and/or parents for program purposes as required
6. Assists with other aspects of children's education as needed, including toileting supervision and specialized health care
7. Performs other related duties as assigned

TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT: Salary and work year to be according to current schedule; classified salary schedule, class 25
